At the Alternative Gift Giving Fair which will be held before, after, and between our two gatherings on December 3rd, you will have a chance to purchase such a meaningful gift. Donate to a non-profit in the name of someone on your Christmas list in lieu of a more traditional gift.

Who and What Are The Non-Profits That Will Be Represented

Heifer International This organization has worked to bring help, healing, and hope to millions of impoverished families worldwide. With help from donors, Heifer International has worked directly and indirectly in more than 30 countries where hunger and despair once prevailed. What could be a better gift than to donate a chick, or a goat to feed a family? How about a dairy cow which can produce up to 4 gallons of milk a day---enough for a family to drink and share with their neighbors.

Zozu Project Our local non-profit started by Mick and Elaine Lebens to end poverty in the village of Arua, Uganda. Starting with a bore hole water well and furnishings for Solid Rock Christian School, Saint John's has partnered with Zozu to provide clean water, and an education for the children in this small African community. The word "Zozu" means thrive in the local tribal language and we have been instrumental in helping these children thrive through our donations and student sponsorship program which pays for all school expenses including 2 meals a day for just \$35.00/month. Classroom furniture and sponsorships are needed to be ready for the start of the new school year in February, 2018.

Homeless Coalition's Showers for the People Program The Homeless Coalition is partnering with Lifepoint Church and Arroyo Grande Hospital to restore dignity and hope to the homeless in our County by providing portable showers and clean clothing. This project has been on our local KSBY news lately and in so many cases it restores the hope of those people who find themselves without a place to live.

Lutheran World Relief We are focusing on their irrigation project that assists farmers and farm communities in investigating and analyzing the water sources which are available to them and the capacity of these sources to provide water for irrigation over an extended period of time.

All donations to these non-profits are tax deductible, and certificates are available to indicate the name of our loved one and what is being donated in their name. Who wouldn't be excited to have a beautiful Ugandan necklace with the proceeds going to the Zozu project or the opportunity to sponsor a child for \$35.00 a month? What a joy to give an animal and provide food or milk for a community or to restore dignity to our homeless friends! Please join us on December 3rd in the commons area and do your Christmas shopping early!

Message From The Council President

SERVICE AND OWNERSHIP

We are coming to the end of another year. Many if not all of you will be thinking of the upcoming holiday season both with your immediate family and your church family. It is what we as families do during this joyous celebration of Christ's birth. Also coming up at this time is our congregational meeting. The first half concerns approving a budget for fiscal year 2018. This meeting will occur in December. The second half will occur in January. At this second half of the meeting we have the reports of the various standing committees and select slates of candidates to serve on council and the nominating committee.

I would first like to discuss the purpose of the first session which is the approval of an operating budget. A budget is nothing more than an agreed upon guide as to how we allocate our financial resources. Because the budget affects all members of the congregation, it must be approved by the congregation. There have been years when we have agreed to a budget that is balanced, i.e. expected income meets expected expenses. Other years we have budgets that have a built in deficit i.e. challenge factor. Either type has its advantages and disadvantages. However, once we approve a budget, it is our responsibility to make sure we meet the goals it outlines. That means we all take possession of the budget and make sure it succeeds. The budget that will be presented to us this year will be challenging but realistic. It will be our budget, and we will be responsible for making sure it succeeds. It is, therefore, incumbent on us as members of this congregation to make a real effort to block out enough time to study it *AND* attend the meeting to vote on it. It is not a done deal until we vote it so.

The second part of the meeting that occurs in January is no less important to the health of our congregation. We review the reports of the standing committees. We elect council members and a nominating committee from those who have agreed to serve. It is to this latter detail that I wish to address you. This is my third stint as a council member. I cannot say all those years were fun. But, they all were satisfying. I daresay that if you ask most who have served in this position how they felt about their service they would say it was gratifying. It is important that all aspects of the congregation be represented (young, old, single, married, male and female.) At this point in my essay I would have a tendency to be somewhat of a scold because historically so many have said no to service on council. I will resist that tendency. Serving on council is a team effort. It is the place where direction is given to meet God's will for our church. There is no pre-requisite in giving input and sharing ideas. The only requirement is about one hour a month. The nominating committee will call some of you at the end of this year and ask if you would be willing to serve on council. I would ask that you be willing, yes even enthusiastic, to have your name added to the slate.

This is your church. Study and approve a budget you can support. When called to service prayerfully consider, and then you might just stand up and enthusiastically say "Yes, I will!"
