





God has big plans to equip us all for ministry together. Thanks for answering the call.



Get Into The Word

Guardians, a Crash Course in Christian Apologetics Tuesday, September 4th at 6:30pm

Why is there something rather than nothing?
How did the universe begin to exist?
Can we be good without God?
Why do bad things happen to people?
Is Jesus really the only way to God?

Have you ever wondered about any of these big fundamental questions? If so, then join us this September and October for **Guardians**, a crash course in Christian apologetics presented by Tyler Drysdale. In this eight-week class you'll be learning about arguments and evidence for God and Christianity from philosophy, science, and history that will help support your faith and allow you be ready to give a defense for the hope that is in you. You'll learn several logical arguments that demonstrate God's existence, launch an investigation into the truth of the Gospel accounts, and also consider rebuttals of some common objections leveled against Christianity. Above all, you'll learn how to be *on guard* as a true Guardian of your faith: how you can be confident in what you believe and share the truth in love with those who don't yet know Christ.

This class will cover fascinating topics such as scientific models of the universe, the nature of infinity, the various ways the universe is fine-tuned for life, the development of morality, the historical accuracy of the Gospels, the problem of suffering and evil, and the Bible's claim that Jesus is the only way to God. Don't be intimidated, though: you don't have to be a professional scientist, philosopher, or historian to get value out of this class. These topics will be broken down in an accessible and engaging way. All you need to bring is a notepad, writing utensil, your critical thinking skills, and your questions!

The first class meeting is **Tuesday**, **September 4 at 6:30pm.** Classes will meet Tuesday evenings every week for eight weeks (ending October 23rd) and last 1.5 to 2 hours per session. Please RSVP on the clipboard in the Commons if you plan on attending.





"Never"

Have you ever felt so strongly about not doing something that you adamantly thought or said, "I'll NEVER do that!" "Never" - that is a word that is not in our awesome God's vocabulary! When we say "never", I think God takes it as a personal challenge! Why? Because He is the God of "Ever"! Nothing is impossible with God!

Last year just about this time, not long after we had had our first Dress A Girl Workshop, we were sitting in our weekly staff meeting discussing events of the past week and how we were adding more events and needed people to step up to take some of the load off Cindi who pretty much spearheaded Children's Ministry, along with Dress A Girl, the Prayer Ministry, writing a weekly blog - a lot for one person! Half joking, sitting across from me, she said, "You've got your choice you can be in charge of Children's Ministry or Dress A Girl." Well, you know what my choice was!

Here's the thing though – I had told Cindi, "I'll do anything but not with kids - I'll NEVER do that - I'm not good with kids." Do you think God was listening? Here I am this year acquiescing to Cindi's request that I do Projects with a Purpose for VBS, highlighting Dress A Girl and Scarf Knitting for the Homeless. God took my "NEVER" and turned it in to His "EVER".

There's more - the day before VBS, this small voice in my ear said, "You need to start a knitting class for the kids and have them come to Dress A Girl to learn to make dresses." Really, God? You want me to work with kids?" There was no verbal answer other than the strong sense of, "You say NEVER, I say EVER."

The presence of the Holy Spirit was evident during Projects with a Purpose - God's will being done. Kids touched by poverty, homelessness and a strong sense to help. I never suggested that they might want to learn to make dresses or scarves - they asked if I would teach them! When we say "NEVER" God says, "I am the one who provides seed ...And then bread to eat. In the same way He will provide and increase your resources and then produce a great harvest of generosity in you." 2 Corinthians 9:10

The outcome remains to be seen but with God in the details, His will, will be done.

Annual Empty Bowl Lunch is Wednesday, September 26 at St. Patrick's Catholic Church's Hall, 11:00-1:30 p.m. Tickets are \$25 as a benefit for 5 Cities Homeless Coalition. Our own Pastor Greg will be one of the local dignitaries serving soup. If you've never attended, this is how it works: You select a handmade bowl by a local artist (there are over one hundred from which to choose). Once you select your bowl, there are typically 5 delicious soups to choose from, by local restaurants and fresh bread too.

How will this money be used? Sometimes, it's a one-time help for an immediate need: utilities, rent, gas, bus voucher, car repair, employment, emergency food. Other needs are short term medical help, Detox for substance abuse, a Warming Center for cold and rainy nights.

FAQs

How do members give by text message?

After members register, they will receive instructions on how to send donations by text message. Text donations are sent to a 10-digit number where they are received and processed by Vanco. Your organization is provided with a dedicated 10-digit number.

How will the church know when a text donation is made?

Text donations will appear on Vanco's standard processing reports along with all other transactions.

How do members know when their donations are processed?

Members receive immediate confirmation via text that their donation was received. After a text donation has been processed, it appears on the member's credit card statement.

How quickly are text donations deposited?

Text donations are electronically deposited into the church bank account within 2 to 4 business days for credit and debit card transactions.

Are all contributions set at a fixed dollar amount?

No. The member chooses the amount of the donation.

Are text donations ever charged to a member's mobile phone bill?

No. Donations are processed using the payment method specified in the member's online profile. Phone carriers handle only the text message, never any financial information.

What payment methods are available for giving by text?

Vanco Give+ Text supports donations via credit and debit cards.

Can members set up recurring donations by text?

Yes. Donors can text "Repeat" after they've made a donation to make it recurring. They can also text "Schedule" to set up a recurring donation.

Can members text donations to individual funds?

Yes, a special texting code must be included in the text message to assign the donation to a particular fund. Your church determines the Texting Code (e.g. "Haiti") when setting up the fund with Vanco.

From the President's Desk



CHANGE IS THE SPICE OF LIFE

"Change – to move in a different direction"
What would life be without change. Be it change in life style, a new place to live, a new climate, new friends or a new way of looking at things.

Change is part of living our lives as humans and children of God. It is inevitable. If we let it happen it gives new vibrancy to our life paths. Our lives are basically a series of change from infancy through childhood into adulthood and eventually (if we are lucky) into our "golden years". Each stage is a change from the previous one. We should relish what we have passed through and look expectantly for new things to happen in the future. For some, change is something to shy from. Those who don't embrace it try to hang onto the past. I would hope that all of us can move into the future not shaking with fear but to grab hold of that future and enjoy the ride.

As most of you know, my wife of forty-seven years passed in October of 2015. The loss of a spouse is usually devastating. Grief at that loss can be short or long; enervating or enlightening. I look back on my life with Suzanne with both happiness and sadness. Happy that I was privileged to have her as my companion for over half my life and sad that I no longer have my life companion to share my journey. On her death I could have retreated into solitude and loneliness. I chose not to retreat from the world, but to move on to the next phase and embrace it.

Moving is another big change. I recently completed a move to a smaller more manageable home that better suits my needs and ability to care for it. Was there some trepidation on my part for making this decision at my age? Certainly! However, I know that a change was necessary if I was not going to be brought down by managing a too large piece of property. I am comfortable in a smaller abode. It gives me the opportunity to spend more time the way I wish to.

Music has always been for me a way to experience God. Whether it be a beautiful classical symphony or a great rock and roll piece. Either listening to music or participating in its production is for me a very spiritual time. When I first arrived at Saint John's I came from a very conservative, liturgical manner of worship. The contemporary manner of the first service was to me almost sacrilegious. Yet I grew to appreciate the exuberance of the service and modernity of the songs and how they were performed. I appreciate some ties to the past, but relish change and a new way of looking at things.

This congregation has experienced some major upheavals in the past few years. I won't go into details of those changes. Those that have been here for a long enough time know what those changes were and how they could have broken a weaker congregation. Yet most of the congregation have come to the realization that some change is inevitable. Those that have remained through the troubled times are stronger in their commitment to the life of the church and those individuals who comprise it. That is the point I wish to make. Change is change. It is neither good or bad in itself. It is how we as a group decide to react to it. I have been privy to some who fear the future as it is being laid before them. That you should relay these misgivings to me is good. It's the beginning of acceptance. I know that as we age, change is not comfortable. But, in the end it can take us to a better place physically and spiritually. What would life be without change? In a few words: dull and boring. I would ask that you consider that as this congregation moves to a different paradigm. Who knows, given a chance you might like the change and wish to become part of it.
