Christmas Gift Giving Alternative December 2

An Alternative Gift Giving for Christmas Fair is being offered in the Commons area on Sunday, December 2, at St. John's between 8:30 am and 12:30 pm. So many of us have people on our Christmas lists that are difficult to shop for because they already have most of what they need or want. This Christmas Fair is your chance to support a charitable cause in honor of those on your Christmas list. WHAT AN AMAZING WAY TO SPREAD GOD'S LOVE TO THOSE IN NEED THROUGHOUT THE WORLD WHILE HONORING OUR LOVED ONES AT CHRISTMAS by making a donation in their honor!!!



At our Alternative Gift Giving for Christmas Fair, we will be featuring several charitable organizations including:

(a) **HEIFER INTERNATIONAL** – donations in the name of someone on your Christmas list for the purchase of farm animals to sustain small farms in Africa.

(b) **ZOZU PROJECT** – donations support this locally based non-profit organization that supports Solid Rock Christian School in Arua, Uganda. Donations can be made for school supplies and physical education equipment; for the planning of the construction of a high school; or to sponsor a child. In addition beaded boxes, eyeglass keepers, beaded jewelry and Christmas garlands will be available for a donation.

(c) **HOMELESS COALITION SHOWERS FOR THE PEOPLE PROJECT** – donations will cover the cost of rental showers and water for the homeless in our community who do not have access to showers.

(d) **FEED OUR PEOPLE PROJECT** – donations cover the cost of food and supplies for the project offered by Iglesia Luterana (the Hispanic church in Santa Maria started by Pastor Pat Muran). This project offers weekly lunch and prayer conducted by Pastor Estovan and his wife, Angie, for the field workers in the Santa Maria produce fields.

Each of these non-profits will be available for you to make a Christmas gift donation in the name of a loved one. All donations are tax deductible.

This event is sponsored by the Social Outreach Services team. We hope you will come and support our efforts to share in the true spirit of Christmas by giving meaningful gifts to our loved ones and at the same time helping those who need our help the most.

We made sundresses, peasant dresses and shorts. Altogether it was a very productive workshop. There are at least 25-30 kits each of sundresses, peasant dresses and shorts for those of you who want to sew over the holidays. We won't meet in December but will resume our workshop in January 2019 on the 12th. A quick update on the dresses we sent to Myanmar- it was monsoon season when our friends who transported the dresses got home. The roads and bike paths into the village where the school is were all flooded but should soon be passable. The God moment in this story is that

Marissa, the daughter of the friends who took the dresses was so touched by the idea behind Dress A Girl and the love that goes into each dress that she has made it her mission to personally deliver the dresses as soon as she can ride her bike to the school. We concentrated on blessing the young girls at the school - and I'm sure they will be - but God chose Marissa to receive His message and in turn deliver that message to the school.

Saint John's Text Donation Number is (805) 250-4073

To register the first time....Enter text number, (805) 250-4073, Enter **amount** of donation or type "**assist**", **SEND** text. Follow prompts to register

FAQs

How do members give by text message?

After members register, they will receive instructions on how to send donations by text message. Text donations are sent to a 10-digit number where they are received and processed by Vanco. Your organization is provided with a dedicated 10-digit number.

How will the church know when a text donation is made?

Text donations will appear on Vanco's standard processing reports along with all other transactions.

How do members know when their donations are processed?

Members receive immediate confirmation via text that their donation was received. After a text donation has been processed, it appears on the member's credit card statement.

How quickly are text donations deposited?

Text donations are electronically deposited into the church bank account within 2 to 4 business days for credit and debit card transactions.

Are all contributions set at a fixed dollar amount?

No. The member chooses the amount of the donation.

Are text donations ever charged to a member's mobile phone bill?

No. Donations are processed using the payment method specified in the member's online profile. Phone carriers handle only the text message, never any financial information.

What payment methods are available for giving by text?

Vanco Give+ Text supports donations via credit and debit cards.

Can members set up recurring donations by text?

Yes. Donors can text "Repeat" after they've made a donation to make it recurring. They can also text "Schedule" to set up a recurring donation.

Can members text donations to individual funds?

Yes, a special texting code must be included in the text message to assign the donation to a particular fund. Your church determines the Texting Code (e.g. "Haiti") when setting up the fund with Vanco.
