


Dress A Girl


Scarves & Hat Knitting



Council Highlights from Meeting on July 15, 2024:

- 1. Pastor Greg continues to lead council through the book, "Canoeing the Mountains". Our challenge is to find ways to navigate the church in changing times.
- 2. Ukulele Sunday saw a 10% increase over last year! Thanks to all, especially the Goodwin's, for a fantastic day of worship and fellowship.
- 3. Greg will have another new member class in September or October. Be sure to welcome our newest visitors and members.
- 4. We will once again participate in the Harvest Festival Sept. 27-28. More details to follow.
- 5. Thanks to Janice and Roger for the new banner frame on the front of the sanctuary. We've already received positive feedback from many!
- 6. Our building painting and repair project will pick up soon and be completed, repairing all weather and age damages.
- 7. Research continues into the possibility of a Christian Children's Center. Cindi continues gathering information and details regarding the establishment requirements. More information to follow as this process continues.
- 8. Due to lack of participation, the Council Connect zoom meetings held by Janice are discontinued. Council urges all to speak directly to any council or staff member with any and all questions and concerns. (See page 14 for contact info and picture list of current council members.)

Letter from Council President

Do you hear the call to service and wonder how you can help?

If you are able and willing, the joy of serving in ministry comes in many forms... and Saint John's needs you!

If you are not already aware, Lois Franks has been coming every Saturday, and many other days of the week, to pull weeds, spray weeds, remove dead flowers and perform pruning and fertilizing. While this focus to beautify the grounds remains one of her passions in service and ministry to the body of Saint Johns, physical limitations for Lois and others who used to work side by side with her have led her to request assistance of any and all interested parishioners to take up the mantle to carry on the vision and goal of keeping the grounds gorgeously maintained.

What you see and appreciate in the serene park like setting is only because of dedicated souls performing the work. Lois would love to have others join her in this effort and learn from her expertise as a Master Gardner. Anyone interested should try to schedule and meet with Lois to understand the vision for shaping and maintenance requirements of the grounds. Thank you, Lois for your gift of time and expertise serving God in this way, and your willingness to educate interested parties to continue implementing the vision and ministry of landscape and site maintenance!

The first Saturday of every month has been a special workday announced at church for all comers to join in the clean-up and additional projects needed for the grounds, building, and special needs projects. For example, in May, landscape maintenance and storage building cleanup were performed along with work progressing to repair rotted exterior trim boards and the in-progress work repainting of the exterior of the main church building. Bring your tools and pitch in.

Weekly maintenance items include:

- Wednesday is the trash pick-up day to empty all waste and recycling containers.
- Every Thursday, a paid landscape crew come to mow and trim hedges and shrubs and special projects when directed by Lois once a month
- A minimum of one green waste can needs to be empty and available for landscape trimmings on Thursdays.
- Weekly removal of dead flowers on plants, pruning of roses and shrubs is always needed.
- Weekly removal of blown in or tossed trash and debris should be picked up, preferably before Sunday morning.
- Waste bags for dog refuse and disposal should be checked each week and bags replaced, bins emptied as needed.
- The Scout troops have a volunteer who mows and weed sprays the natural growth of weeds in the areas between the creek and lawn. Communication and coordination with the Scout leaders may be helpful to keep the area looking nice and under control.

Monthly maintenance needs include:

- There is always weeding to stay on top of while monthly workdays are intended to address heavier pruning, and cleanup, removing dead limbs from trees and shrubs and small plants.
- Spray weeds, aphids and mold or fungus as needed.
- If anyone is willing to bring a chipper on workdays, the mulch can be used in planter areas. In the past wood chips were donated by and tree service...finding a new source would be helpful.
- On monthly workdays some have brought their green waste containers from home to fill and take back home for pick up due to the excessive amounts generated that day.

Other occasional needs:

(Letter continued)

- Well water is the source for irrigation and currently has no filter system. A filter system would be helpful (donations anyone?). Water from hose bibs at the building are sourced from a city system and should be used in sprayers, remote hose bibs are not filtered, some of the main valves are usually off that supply them.
- In the past Ron Werner has performed efforts to eradicate gophers and moles.
- Currently Peter Ritenauer, a paid professional, has cleaned or replaced and checked sprinkler functions.
- Locals often use the trash & recycle cans for personal use putting trash in the recycle bin. If cans are empty, it has been effective to lay them down in the planter area next to the trash enclosure, so others don't put their trash inside. Security Cameras have not been able to see the area to help correct the misuse. (FYI - camera system needs an upgrade)
- Special repairs are needed to reattach one of the ornamental metal petals at the gate to the memorial grounds... (anyone have light gage welding experience?)
- Other special projects arise around the holidays to set up and take down decorations.

As you can see, there is a great deal of work to be done - we need your help!

Contact Lois at 805-698-4093 to schedule a time to work with her to learn and participate in the ongoing ministry to keep Saint John's an attractive place for worship, fellowship, and outside activities. If your schedule works better to volunteer at a time other than Saturday morning, reach out to Lois and she will provide a list of items that currently need focus and attention and can meet or work with you. Volunteering can be once, or on a regular schedule. No experience is required!
